In connection with the International Exhibition of The stre Art now on view at The Museum of Modern Art, Cleon Throckmorton, noted scene designer, will be the guest speaker of the "Women's Radio Review" on Station WEAF and network Mondey afternoon at three:thirty. Mr. Throckmorton will talk on American Stage Designers and will enumerate qualities necessary to the successful pursuit of that career.

In his opinion, the scenic designer must be artist, engineer, and architect, occasionally a plumber, always a diplomat and, whenever possible, lucky. He cites several instances of luck in his own career, particularly when a stage hand inadertantly thrust his foot through the gelatine covering of the floodlight and instead of disaster produced a magnificent cloud effect for the arranged original production of O'Neill's "Emperor Jones."
