Mr. Trygve Lie, first Secretary General of the UN, and Dr. Grayson Kirk, President of Columbia University, will be the main speakers at ceremonies opening the new Abby Aldrich Rockefeller Sculpture Garden at the Museum of Modern Art, 11 West 53 Street, on Tuesday, April 28, at 5 p.m.

The garden, the first in America designed for the exhibition of modern sculpture, will be open to the public the following day as a permanent addition to the Museum. Completely transformed since it was closed last summer, the new garden has been turned into a sunken, marble-paved outdoor exhibition area with two reflecting pools and planted with trees, flowers and evergreens. It is named in honor of the late Mrs. John D. Rockefeller, Jr., one of the founders and major benefactors of the Museum of Modern Art.

Mr. Lie will speak on the importance of cultural activities in fostering international relations and the Museum of Modern Art's program in this respect as demonstrated by the current international exhibition "Sculpture of the Twentieth Century," the first exhibition in the new garden. Dr. Kirk will describe the contribution of the Museum to New York City.

General A. Conger Goodyear, trustee and first President of the Museum, will introduce the speakers and discuss Mrs. Rockefeller's importance to modern art. Mr. David Rockefeller, one of the late Mrs. Rockefeller's sons and also a trustee of the Museum, will cut the ribbon symbolizing the opening of the garden.

Among the United Nations officials, Museum directors, civic leaders and artists who have accepted invitations to attend the opening ceremonies are: Sir Gladwyn Jebb, Permanent Representative to the UN, Italian Ambassador H.E.M. Gastone Guidotti, Mrs. Arthur Hays Sulzberger, the Consul Generals of Italy, Switzerland and Spain, Mrs. Carmel Snow of Harpers Bazaar, Mr. Herman More of the Whitney Museum.
