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## SWEDISH FILM RETROSPECTIVE AT MUSEUM OF MODERN ART

A three-month retrospective of <u>Swedish Films</u>, 1909-1957, will be shown at the Museum of Modern Art, 11 West 53 Street, beginning October 10. Thirty-one features and several short subjects comprise the most complete historical survey of Swedish films ever presented. Showings will be at 3 and 5:30 daily. Margareta Akermark of the Museum's Film Library organized the series, which is directed by Einar Lauritzen, Director of the Swedish Film Museum, in collaboration with the Swedish Institute and Svenk Filmindustri, Stockholm, and Janus Films, New York.

The series opens with a program of silent <u>Swedish Primitives</u> (1909),

<u>New York Vignettes</u> (1911), and Victor Sjöström's first feature, <u>Ingeborg</u>

<u>Holm</u> (1913); proceeds with work by such notable Scandinavian directors as

<u>Mauritz Stiller</u>, Alf Sjöberg, Gustaf Molander, S. Bauman, Arne Sucksdorff,

and Gösta Werner; and concludes with six films by Ingmar Bergman. Several

films will be shown for the first time in this country, among them Sjöström's

classic <u>Terje Vigen</u> (1916), Stiller's <u>Erotikon</u> (1920), and Molander's

original version of <u>Intermezzo</u> (1936), with Ingrid Bergman. Greta Garbo

is seen in <u>The Story of Gösta Berling</u>, Signe Hasso in <u>Career</u> (1938) and

Mai Zetterling in <u>Torment</u> (1944).

A 32-page illustrated brochure to be issued in connection with the series has notes and biographical sketches by Mr. Lauritzen and an introduction by Richard Griffith, Curator of the Museum's Film Library.

Music for the silent films is arranged and played by Arthur Kleiner.

Admission to the Museum is \$1.00; members free. There is no additional charge for film showings.
