Jennifer Licht, Associate Curator of Painting and Sculpture at The Museum of Modern Art, will present an illustrated lecture on "The Machine" on Thursday, February 6 at 12 noon in the Museum Auditorium in connection with the current exhibition THE MACHINE AS SEEN AT THE END OF THE MECHANICAL AGE. Mrs. Licht assisted Pontus Hulten, Director of Moderna Museet, Stockholm, who organized THE MACHINE exhibition for The Museum of Modern Art.
