SUMMERGARDEN PRESENTS SMALL PLANET IN TWO FREE CONCERTS AT THE MUSEUM OF MODERN ART
TEN FREE CONCERTS BY SONGWRITERS HIGHLIGHT VARIED AND UNUSUAL SEASON
ARP SYNTHESIZER, CHAMBER MUSIC AND JAZZ ARE FEATURED

SMALL PLANET, a jazz group rooted in southern country-blues, performs original songs in free SUMMERGARDEN concerts at 8 pm Friday, June 7 and Saturday, June 8 at The Museum of Modern Art. Made possible by a grant from Mobil Oil Corporation, SUMMERGARDEN opens the Museum's Sculpture Garden free to the public from 6 pm to 11 pm every Friday, Saturday and Sunday through September 29. A wide range of entertainment selected by Ed Bland, producer for Vanguard Records, is presented Fridays and Saturdays at 8 pm. Entrance is through the Garden gate at 8 West 54 Street. Seating is informal.

SMALL PLANET's original material and vocals by Deborah McColl and Ron Norris (lead guitar) and vocal and instrumental back-up by Sam Broussard (guitar) and Brian Cummings (bass, sax and clarinet) produce a jazz-rock style derived from the southern country blues of Hank Williams and Jackson Brown. SMALL PLANET (formerly SILVERMAN) has appeared in concert with Cat Stevens, John Hartford, Chick Corea, Eric Anderson, Harry Chapin, Shawn Phillips, Rick Nelson and Cheech & Chong. They have appeared at more than 20 colleges on the eastern seaboard and in clubs throughout the east and midwest including recent performances at My Father's Place in Roslyn, L.I., The Great Southeast Music Hall in Atlanta and The Raven Gallery in Detroit.

Other SUMMERGARDEN performances by composers singing their own works include Folkways recording artist and WBAI regular MICHAEL COHEN; CARL ROSENSTOCK, and JOHN and CARRIE CARNEY in July; and BRAID in early August.

Next week, critically acclaimed Metropolitan Opera guitarist WILLIAM MATTHEWS presents informal programs of works by Dowland, Ponce, Kreneck and Villa-Lobos (8 pm Friday, June 14 and Saturday, June 15). Schedule of performances on reverse side. (over)
