## DOWNTOWN/UPTOWN: a little night "new" music in MoMA's SUMMERGARDEN

KAREN YAGER, Guest Director, has long been involved with the world of contemporary art and music and is frequently heard on topical radio programs on WNCN, WNYC and WBAI.

She most recently produced and directed COUNTERWEIGHT, a major 21 day festival of contemporary music in New York and COME BLOW THY HORN AT HUNTER, a benefit concert for WNCN's Listeners' Guild, which she helped found and now serves, as a member of its Board of Directors. She was Administrative Director of St. Luke's Chamber Ensemble and has worked with Children's Free Opera of New York.

Originally a music student at The High School of Music and Art in New York, she later earned her B.S. degree in biology and chemistry from The City College of New York; received two National Science Foundation research grants which resulted in the publication of a monograph in the field of Entomology for The American Museum of Natural History; did graduate work in bio-chemistry, psychology, art history and studio art at The University of Chicago, Columbia University, The University of California at Berkeley and at The Art Students' League of New York; served her apprenticeship in art conservation and restoration with Gustav Berger; and for seven years has headed her own conservation/restoration studio in New York City.
