EIGHTH SUMMERGARDEN TO OPEN FRIDAY, JUNE 2, 1978

SUMMERGARDEN -- a special series of free events on weekend evenings in The Museum of Modern Art's Sculpture Garden -- opens for its eighth consecutive season on Friday, June 2, 1978.

During the 14 week Summergarden season (through September 3), the public may view The Museum's world-famous Sculpture Garden every Friday, Saturday and Sunday from 6 PM to 10 PM without paying an admission fee.

Informal entertainment is presented at 8 PM on Fridays and Saturdays.

Entrance is through the huge iron Sculpture Garden gate at 8 West 54 St.

Summergarden has been made possible since its inception in 1971 by grants from MOBIL CORPORATION. Since then, more than 350,000 visitors have enjoyed Summergarden's free concerts, recitals and special performances by some 150 promising young performing artists.

Among sculptures on view are large-scale works by such masters as Rodin, Matisse, Picasso and Moore, all set amid the reflecting pools and fountains of the Garden's landscaped, park-like terraces.
