FILMS FROM THE ARCHIVES AND A HISTORY OF FILM ANNOUNCE SUMMER SCHEDULE AT THE MUSEUM OF MODERN ART

Two of the Museum's popular, on-going series, FILMS FROM THE ARCHIVES and A HISTORY OF FILM, will enjoy a two-month summer break following the July screenings. Both programs will resume in October, on Tuesdays and Thursdays respectively, in the Museum's Roy and Niuta Titus Theaters. During the hiatus, the Department of Film will mount its special, golden anniversary exhibition, 50 YEARS OF FILM AT MoMA.

FILMS FROM THE ARCHIVES serves as a review of the Museum's diverse collection of some 10,000 motion pictures from every period, nation, and tradition of filmmaking. The Department of Film presents selections in a simple and impartial manner, alphabetically by title. The July schedule includes only films that begin with the letter A: At the Crossroads of Life, The Avenging Conscience, Around the World in Eighty Minutes with Douglas Fairbanks, Anatomy of a Murder, Adrienne Lecouvreur. The program will proceed to the letter B this fall.

A HISTORY OF FILM--a cycle of some 100 programs drawn from the Museum's archives--traces the development of the motion picture from the 1890s to the present. The current cycle explores the ways in which major directors and cinematographers adapted (or avoided) the moving camera for their own purposes, and the way its use reflected more general esthetic and technological trends during each era of film history.

FILMS FROM THE ARCHIVES is organized by Jon Gartenberg, assistant curator in the archives, and Stephen Harvey, assistant curator for exhibitions, in the Department of Film. A HISTORY OF FILM has been programmed by Herbert Reynolds in co-operation with Adrienne Mancia, curator for exhibitions, and Stephen Harvey. The Museum's film programs are made possible with support from the New York State Council on the Arts and by a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts.
