Museum of Modern Art's 30th Anniversary Drive, aims at \$25,000,000 for additional building, and for endowment and program funds. The drive was launched last year because the Museum's Collections, activities and demands for its services have all grown phenomenally; its physical plant and endowment have failed to keep pace with this growth.

Country Art Gallery: Founded in 1953. Mrs. Douglas A. McCrary and Mrs. Payson are the owners; Mrs. Edward L. Watson is Director. The Gallery also operates the Country Art School for children and adults and several times a year organizes lectures, demonstrations or round table discussions which are open to students and their friends. A new exhibition is presented every three weeks from September through June. This is the first from the Museum of Modern Art to be presented there.
