## JUNE OPENINGS AND EVENTS

June 1-July 29 SUMMER TERM OF CREATIVE ART CLASSES, at the Museum's People's Art Center, 21 West 53 Street, for children aged 6 to 18, parents and adults. Students may take the full two months course or a half course during either June or July. A few openings in June

classes are still available. The second term begins July 6.

\*June 17 through the summer JAPANESE HOUSE. Designed by Junzo Yoshimura, well-known contemporary Japanese architect, the house was built in Japan and shipped to New York to be reassembled in the Museum's outdoor exadmission 60¢ hibition area. Based on 16th and 17th century Japanese prototypes

which have long been regarded as particularly relevant to modern western architecture, the house consists of two large rooms, several galleries and verandas, attached pavilions for the kitchen, tea house and bath, as well as a garden and a large pool.

June 23-Aug. 15 NILES SPENCER. A memorial exhibition of the work of this American painter, (1893-1952), organized by Dorothy C. Miller for the Museum's Department of Circulating Exhibitions. Third floor.

June 23-Sept.19 ABSTRACT JAPANESE CALLIGRAPHY. 40 examples, shown for the first time in this country, of the new calligraphy which the Japanese have developed out of their own traditions. Third floor.

Many major works from abroad are being seen for the first time in this country. Third floor. (opened April 7)

Such modern masters as Matisse, Rodin, Picasso, Grosz and Modigliani are represented in the exhibition. Auditorium Gallery. (opened April 21)

Thru Aug. 1 JACQUES LIPCHITZ. The most comprehensive retrospective to date of the work of the famous French sculptor. The exhibition consists of a complete review of his life's work from 1911 until the present. Included in the exhibition are several important sculptures which have never before been seen in this country. On view in the first floor galleries and in the Museum Garden. (opened May 19)
