The world premier of a feature film of Bengal village life produced by one of India's leading film makers, Satyajit Ray, will be held at the Museum of Modern Art, 11 West 53 Street, on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings, May 17 and 18, at 8:30p.m. This is the final event in the series "The Living Arts of India" sponsored by the Museum's Junior Council in connection with the large exhibition of textiles and ornamental arts of India now on view on the Museum's first floor.

"The Story of Apu and Durga" is set in Nishchindapur, a village on the Ichchamati River, surrounded by mango orchards, bamboo groves, banana and coconut trees. Apu and Durga are brother and sister and the story is of their growing up and the struggles and hardships of their parents.

The Tuesday evening showing is sold out, but tickets are available for Wednesday, May 18th. Tickets are \$2.25 for Museum members and students, \$3.00 for non-members.
