An annual exhibition called "EXHIBITION OF INVENTIONS IN CRAFTSMANSHIP" will open with a public reception on Friday evening, March 23, from 8 to 11 pm at the Museum of Modern Art Library. Sponsored by a public service by the trustees for the newly proposed Art Center at Hastings-on-Hudson, the exhibition will remain in view at the Library Library through April 4 and will be open from 2pm to 5pm in the afternoons and from 7pm to 9pm in the evenings. No admission will be charged and the public is cordially invited to attend.

The exhibition consists of 100 exhibits in a visual presentation of the fine arts of creative craftsmanship as contrasted with primitive methods still prevalent in some parts. Through a series of photographic panels, made by leading photographers, original paintings and drawings by collectors, curators, transparencies and Xerographic color prints, it describes the importance and scope of the present day progress for all children. The exhibition was prepared under the direction of Walter Alling, Director of the Department of Education of the Museum of Modern Art, New York, and chairman of the Committee on Art Education, Board of Education of and teachers throughout all levels of education from preschool through college. It was presented at the Institute of Modern Art last year as part of the Museum's 25th Anniversary exhibition.

In the January showing of this exhibition, the term selected in connection with the educational drive for the year was "Year of Better Living," and the theme was "The Family." In January, February, March and April many communities, the schools, libraries and art centers, the religious bodies and other organizations have already added their own contributions.
