The Clarke Terry-Bob Brookmeyer Quintet will give the first Jazz in the Garden concert at the Museum of Modern Art on Thursday, June 21, at 8:30 p.m. Terry, on trumpet and flugelhorn, and Brookmeyer, on valve trombone, will be joined by Eddie Costa, piano, Art Davis, bass, and Ossie Johnson, drums. The series of ten Thursday evening promenade concerts is presented by the Museum in cooperation with the United Nations Jazz Society.

Admission to the Museum is \$1.00; members free. The jazz concert is an additional 50 cents. In case of rain, the concert will be cancelled; tickets will be honored at the concert following. Other Museum activities continue as announced until the 10 p.m. closing. Dinner and refreshments are available in the Penthouse restaurant.

The 1926 silent film, Fig Leaves, featuring George O'Brien, Olive Borden, Andre De Beranger and Phyllis Haver, will be shown in the Museum auditorium at 8 p.m.
