JAZZ IN THE GARDEN AT MUSEUM OF MODERN ART

Jazz in the Garden, ten Thursday evening promenade concerts, will be held again this summer at the Museum of Modern Art, 11 West 53 Street, beginning June 21. The series is to be presented by the Museum in cooperation with the United Nations Jazz Society. Gary Keys, Herb Snitzer and Richard Jennings are in charge of programing and production.

Clarke Terry and the Bob Brookmeyer Quintet will give the opening concert on June 21 at 8:30 p.m. The series continues June 28 with the Herbie Mann Sextet, and July 5 with the Blossom Dearie Quintet. Other programs will be announced.

During the summer, the entire Museum will be open Thursday evenings until 10. The regular Museum admission, \$1.00, admits visitors to galleries and to 8:00 p.m. film showings in the auditorium; there is no charge for Museum members. Admission to jazz concerts in the garden is an additional 50 cents for all. Dinner and refreshments are available in the Penthouse restaurant.

Concert attendance in the Garden is limited to 1,500. Tickets will be placed on sale (in the Museum lobby only) on the Saturday preceding each performance. A few chairs are available on the garden terraces, but most of the audience stands or sits on the ground. In case of rain, the concert will be canceled; tickets will be honored at the concert following. Other Museum activities continue as announced.

Exhibitions on view throughout the summer include Recent Painting USA:

The Figure and Picasso in the Museum of Modern Art: 80th Birthday Exhibition.

Design for Sport and Walker Evans: American Photographs are on view through
July.

Thursday evening film showings will repeat the scheduled afternoon program. The Cinema of Howard Hawks will be screened during the summer.
