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The Pleasure Garden, a 1925/film directed by Alfred Hitchcock, will be shown in the Museum of Modern Art auditorium on May 5 (Sunday) at 3 and 5:30 p.m., and on May 6 through 8 at 5:30 p.m. only. Virginia Valli, Miles Mander, Nita Naldi, and John Stuart are featured. This is the opening program in The Cinema of Alfred Hitchcock, a series of 37 feature and 6 television films made by the eminent British director. The series will continue through November 16, the longest Museum retrospective of the work of a single film maker. Until further notice, because of building construction, film showings will be held daily at 3 p.m. and Saturdays and Sundays at 3 and 5:30.

The Hitchcock series will continue May 9-13 with The Lodger (1926), with Ivor Novello, Malcolm Keen and Arthur Chesney; May 14-18, The Ring with Carl Brisson, Lillian Hall-Davies, Ian Hunter and Gordon Harker; May 19-22, The Farmer's Wife (1928) with Jameson Thomas, Lillian Hall-Davies and Gordon Harker; May 23-26, The Manxman (1929) with Carl Brisson, Malcolm Keen, Anny Ondra; and May 27-June 1, Blackmail (1929) with Anny Ondra, John Longden, Sara Allgood, and Cyril Ritchard.

Peter Bogdanovich arranged the Hitchcock series. He is also author of <u>The Cinema of Alfred Hitchcock</u>, an illustrated monograph issued concurrently by the Museum.
