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Rodin and 20th Century Sculpture, an illustrated lecture by Albert E. Elsen, will be given in the auditorium of the Museum of Modern Art on Thursday, May 9, at 8:30 p.m. The lecture is arranged in connection with the Museum's current Rodin exhibition of about 150 works by "the father of modern sculpture." Dr. Elsen, Associate Professor of Art History at Indiana University, is author of <u>Auguste Rodin</u>, a book written to accompany the exhibition.

Tickets for the lecture, \$1.50 for Museum members, \$2.00 for non-members, 75 cents for students, include admission to Museum galleries, open Thursdays until 9:00 p.m. Dinner and refreshments are available.

Dr. Elsen began his specialized studies of Rodin in 1949 under a Fulbright scholarship. Prior to his present Rodin book for the Museum of Modern Art, he wrote <u>Rodin's Gates of Hell</u>, published 1960 by the University of Minnesota Press. He is also author of <u>Purposes of Art</u>, Holt, Rinehart and Winston, 1962. Dr. Elsen holds M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from Columbia University. He has contributed to many publications and has lectured widely.
