THE RACING CAR: TOWARD A RATIONAL AUTOMOBILE, an exhibition of cars, models and photographs, will be on view at The Museum of Modern Art from September 27 through November 27. David Ash, former racing driver and authority on automobiles, is Technical Director of the exhibition, and has selected the automobiles with Arthur Drexler, Director of the Museum's Department of Architecture and Design. The exhibition suggests that excellence of design and functional performance can be synonymous, as demonstrated by the racing car and its best derivities.

A Formula 1 Grand Prix car, four racing prototypes, eight sports cars and ten touring cars have been selected for the show. Five actual cars will be installed in the Museum galleries along with models and photographs of the others. Singlepurpose cars, such as the fuel dragster and two land speed record cars, are included as well as a number of experimental designs. Vehicles from the United States, Italy, Germany, France and Great Britain are represented.

A symposium entitled "Design and Safety: Toward a Rational Automobile" will be held at the Museum on the evening of November 15. The panel will consist of Commissioner Harry H. Brain and , Bureau of Traffic Safety, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania; Dr. B. J. Campbell, Director of the Highway Research Institute at the University of North Carolina; James Hare, Secretary of State from Michigan; Roy C. Haeusler, Chief Engineer, Safety Engineering Department, Chrysler Corporation; William F. Milliken, Director of the Cornell Aeronautical Laboratory; Dr. Henry H. Wakeland, Director of the New York State Safety Car Program; David Ash and Arthur Drexler. Tickets will be available at the Museum for \$2.25 to Museum members and \$3 to nonmembers.

THE RACING CAR is the third automobile exhibition to be held at the Museum. In 1951 the Museum presented EIGHT AUTOMOBILES and two years later TEN AUTOMOBILES, both concerned with the aesthetics of automobile design in Europe and the United
