Note: The Spanish poet Antonio Machado died in exile in 1939. This portrait (of which the Museum's cast is the second) was commissioned as part of a larger monument to the poet in Baeza, the Andalusian city where he taught for many years. Dedication of the monument, planned for February 20, 1966, was prohibited by the Spanish government authorities. A third cast of the bronze is at Brown University, Providence, Rhode Island.
