Beginning Monday, October 28, The Museum of Modern Art will waive its admission fee for junior and high school students in New York City, and for any parent who accompanies his child to the Museum, Bates Lowry, Director, announced today. This service is being offered to replace the temporary interruption of regularly scheduled visits by New York City school children who are normally admitted free of charge when they come to the galleries with their teachers.

"Those young people in New York who find themselves unexpectedly with more free time than usual, have an unparalleled opportunity to explore the 20th-century arts in our Museum," Mr. Lowry said. "Great achievements of the artists of our time from all parts of the world are here to be seen, studied and enjoyed in photography, film, architecture and design, drawings and prints, as well as painting and sculpture."

The Museum is open daily from 11 a.m. until 6 p.m., Thursday evenings until 9, Sundays from noon to 6 p.m. Films are shown daily at 2 and 5:30 p.m., on Wednesdays films are also shown at noon, and on Saturdays at 11:30 a.m., 3 and 5:30 p.m. Regular admission for adults is \$1.50, for individual students, 75 cents.

Among the current shows on view, in addition to selections from the Museum collections, are Jean Dubuffet at The Museum of Modern Art, Architecture of Museums, Photographs by Paul Caponigro, Garbo Film Stills, Rauschenberg's "Soundings," and the films of Ernst Lubitsch.

Information about the Museum's expanded services will be available through the Office of Cultural Affairs of the Park Department, as well as at the Museum.
