Governor Nelson A. Rockefeller plans to leave to The Museum of Modern Art major works from his collection of paintings and sculpture, it was disclosed tonight. The works include paintings by such modern masters as Picasso, Matisse and Klee.

Announcement of the intended bequest was made by William S. Paley, president of the Museum, at a dinner at the Hotel St. Regis, held in connection with a preview showing of the Governor's collection of modern art which will open at the Museum on May 28th.

The paintings include seven by Picasso -- "Girl With Mandolin," "Job (Still Life)," "Pitcher and Bowl of Fruit," "Girl with Striped Bodice," "Le Torero - Ceret," "La Guitare" and "Interior with Girl Drawing"; two by Gris -- "Le Buffet" and "Guitar, Glasses and Bottle"; two by Braque -- "The Clarinet" and "The Table"; two by Matisse -- "Odalisque in Striped Trousers" and "Collioure"; and two by Klee -- "Fear" and "Heroische Bogenstriche"; one by de Chirico -- "Song of Love"; one by Leger -- "Woman with a Book"; and three Boccionis -- "States of Mind, I: The Farewells," "States of Mind, II: Those Who Go," and "States of Mind, III: Those Who Stay."

The sculptures include "Spiny 1942" by Calder, "Construction in Space" by Gabo, "Dancer (Seated Woman)" by Lehmbruck, "Chant des Voyelles" by Lipschitz, and "Reclining Figure" by Gonzalez.
