The Museum of Modern Art, 14 West 49th Street, announces that on Tuesday, June 28, ¹⁹³⁸ it will open to the public an exhibition of fifteen of the architectural designs submitted in the recent competition for a half-million-dollar art center for Wheaton College, Norton, Mass.

In this important competition 253 unsigned designs were submitted anonymously by 243 individuals and firms from all over the United States. The winning design, by Richard Bennett and Caleb Hornbostel of New York, and the second prize scheme by Gropius and Breuer of Cambridge, Mass. will be shown together with the other designs which were awarded prizes and honorable mentions.

The exhibition will remain on view through Labor Day. The Museum's current exhibition, Masters of Popular Painting, will also remain open until after Labor Day with the exception of about twenty of the paintings, which will be removed to make room for the Wheaton architectural exhibition.
