THE BRAID consists of four musicians from Brooklyn: Tony Gallente (vocals), Joe Porcell (guitar and vocals), Joe O'Nalley (guitar and vocals) and John Parcelli (bass). An easy folk-pop approach to songwriting has brought the group great success in college coffeehouse circuits.

JOHN GUTH, singer, songwriter, composer, guitarist, recently provided the score for HAIKU, an evening of poetry, song and movement produced by the AMAS Repertory Theater. Ed Moran of SHOW BUSINESS said, "...it is John Guth's vibrant and bracing score that adds the greatest unifying note to the narrative. Any one of his compositions might be singled out for its magnetism."
