

## WILLIAM MATTHEWS PLAYS WORKS FOR GUITAR AND LUTE IN SUMMERGARDEN

WILLIAM MATTHEWS presents works for guitar and lute in The Museum of Modern Art's SUMMERGARDEN at 8 PM, Friday and Saturday, August 8 and 9. On the program will be pieces by Dowland, Mudarra, Martin, Ponce, Lauro and Villa-Lobos. Free admission is through the Sculpture Garden gate at 8 West 54 Street.

Matthews' recording of little-known works by Logy, Baron and Weiss was released last year on Turnabout/Vox and he is presently recording an album of guitar music by Latin American composers. Keenly interested in contemporary music, he has worked with Pierre Boulez in his retrospective concert at The Whitney Museum of American Art, and has played with The Contemporary Chamber Ensemble. Of Matthews' performance during a concert by The Contemporary Chamber Ensemble at The Smithsonian Institute, Washington Post critic Paul Hume said, "A suite for solo guitar by Ernest Krenek brought a virtuoso performance by Mr. Matthews."
