VIVIAN TAYLOR, who made her debut at 16 with the Erie Philharmonic (Pennsylvania), has since made appearances with the New Haven Symphony, the New Haven Chamber Players, the Yale Collegium Musicum, and at the Starlight Festival.

Her New York debut in 1974 was assessed by Robert Sherman in The New York Times as "an extraordinary first recital, and a striking introduction to a major new talent". In New York recitals in 1975 and 1976 Ms. Taylor also drew praise. Donal Henahan, also in The New York Times, wrote of her ability to perform "in masterly fashion" and called her "a powerful technician" and "an exciting artist". Mr. Henahan wrote in 1976, "Both for its out-of-the-way programming and its frequently dazzling playing, Miss Taylor's recital could justly be called fantastic."

In addition to her 1976 performances in New York and Boston, Ms. Taylor made her London debut at Wigmore Hall. She has performed on WQXR radio and WGBH in Boston, and on Long Island under the sponsorship of the Roslyn Music Group. She holds a Master of Music from Yale University and recieved her Bachelors degree in music from Cleveland Institute of Music. Her teachers were Arthur Loesser, Ward Davenny, Sascha Gorodnitski and Russell Sherman.

The Museum of Modern Art's Sculpture Garden is open free to the public as SUMMERGARDEN every Friday, Saturday and Sunday, 6 PM to 10 PM, through September 19, 1976. Short informal performances of music are presented at 8 PM on Fridays and Saturdays, while Sundays are reserved for enjoying the sculpture, the moonlight and the music of the splashing fountains. Free admission is through the Sculpture Garden gate at 8 W. 54 St.
