DETROIT PIANIST, ROSEMARY CATANESE, MAKES INFORMAL RECITAL DEBUT IN SUMMERGARDEN

ROSEMARY CATANESE, pianist with The Michigan Chamber Orchestra, will make her New York recital debut with informal performances at 8 PM, Friday and Saturday, July 30 and 31, 1976 in The Museum of Modern Art's SUMMERGARDEN. Free admission is through the Sculpture Garden gate at 8 West 54 Street.

Ms. Catanese will play works by contemporary composers as well as by Mozart and Mendelssohn. New York composer William Penn will assist her in the performance of his work, Miroirs sur le Rubáiyát (1974), and Ruth Shaw Wylie of Estes Park, Colorado, will be represented by her work, Psychogram, which Ms. Catanese recently recorded for CRI Records.

One work by Mozart, Sonata in a minor, K. 310, and two by Mendelssohn, Songs Without Words and Variations Sérieuses, Op. 54 will complete the program.

ROSEMARY CATANESE is pianist with and Assistant Manager of The Michigan Chamber Orchestra, and is on the faculty of Wayne State University.

The Wylie Psychogram is the winner of the 1976 Friends of Harvey Gaul Award and will be published by Columbia University Press. Composed in 1968, it was released on CRI in June of 1976 performed by Ms. Catanese.

William Penn teaches composition, theory and electronic music at the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York, holds a Doctorate in composition from Michigan State University and has received three consecutive grants from The National Endowment for the Arts.

The Museum of Modern Art's Sculpture Garden is open free to the public as SUMMERGARDEN every Friday, Saturday and Sunday, 6 PM to 10 PM, through September 19, 1976. Short informal performances of music are presented at 8 PM every Friday and Saturday, while Sundays are reserved exclusively for enjoying the sculpture, the moonlight and the music of the splashing fountains. Free admission is through the Sculpture Garden gate at 8 West 54th Street.
