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SIDNEY LUMET TO BE PRESENTED WITH NEW YORK STATE HONOR AT MOMA TRIBUTE

SIDNEY LUMET: FILMED IN NEW YORK, a special program of eight of director Lumet's 22 New York films, will be presented in MoMA's Roy and Niuta Titus Auditorium on Sunday, January 3 and Monday, January 4.

Before the public screening of Lumet's most recent film, PRINCE OF THE CITY, on January 4 at 8:30 pm, Mr. Lumet will receive high honors from the State of New York when he is presented with both the State's Life Achievement Citation and one of its brand-new "Made In New York Hall of Fame" awards for his outstanding contribution to film production in the State.

The first special film Hall of Fame award went to James Cagney in ceremonies on December 7, at which Governor Carey also presented new M.I.N.Y. awards to the producers and directors of five films recently shot here.

The regular M.I.N.Y. award, introduced on that occasion, is a crystal emblem, while the special "M.I.N.Y. Hall of Fame" award for continuous and outstanding contribution is embellished with gold leaf.

The awards are the creation of the State Commerce Department's Office for Film and Television Development. George G. Dempster is New York Commissioner of Commerce and Elizabeth Forsling Harris directs the Film Office.

Earlier this week, Sidney Lumet was also named Best Director for PRINCE OF THE CITY in the New York Film Critics Awards.

The selection of films in MoMA's tribute, SIDNEY LUMET: FILMED IN NEW YORK, was made by Adrienne Mancia, Curator of Film Exhibitions, and Larry Kardish, Associate Curator in The Department of Film.
