Barbara Rose organized <u>LEE KRASNER</u>: <u>A RETROSPECTIVE</u> for the Museum of Fine Arts, Houston, where she is Consulting Curator, and collaborated in its installation at The Museum of Modern Art. She received a B.A. from Barnard College and a Ph.D. in the History of Art from Columbia University. In 1961-62, she was a Fulbright Fellow to Spain. She has taught at Yale University; Sarah Lawrence and Hunter Colleges; the University of California, Irvine; and was Regent's Professor at the University of California, San Diego.

A prominent critic of contemporary art, Miss Rose is currently an associate editor of <u>Arts Magazine</u> and <u>Partisan Review</u>. She was formerly New York correspondent for <u>Art International</u> and a contributing editor to <u>Artforum</u> and <u>Art in America</u>. Her writings have twice received the College Art Association Frank Jewett Mather Award for Distinguished Art Criticism.

Miss Rose has curated and co-curated many exhibitions, including <u>Claes</u>

<u>Oldenburg</u> (1969); <u>Patrick Henry Bruce</u> - <u>An American Modernist</u> (1980); <u>Lee</u>

<u>Krasner - Jackson Pollock</u>: <u>A Working Relationship</u> (1980); and <u>Miro in</u>

<u>America</u> (1982). She has recently co-authored the exhibition catalogues <u>Leger</u>

<u>and the Modern Spirit</u> (1982) and <u>Goya</u>: <u>The "Disasters of War" and Selected</u>

<u>Prints from the Collection of the Arthur Roth Foundation</u> (1984).

In addition to the catalogue accompanying <u>LEE KRASNER</u>: <u>A RETROSPECTIVE</u>, Miss Rose is the author and editor of <u>American Painting</u>, <u>American Art Since</u>

1900, <u>Readings in American Art</u>, and several monographs. She has also made films on American artists, among them <u>North Star</u>: <u>Mark di Suvero</u>, <u>Sculptor</u>, and <u>Lee Krasner</u>: <u>The Long View</u>, a Cine Film Festival Gold Eagle Recipient in 1980.
