## SUE B. DORN APPOINTED TO NEW POST AT THE MUSEUM OF MODERN ART

June 1, 1987, New York. . . . Sue B. Dorn has been appointed Deputy Director for Development and Public Affairs at The Museum of Modern Art effective today, announced Richard E. Oldenburg, Director of the Museum. The Departments of Development, Membership, Public Information, and Special Events will report to Mrs. Dorn in this newly created position.

"We are very pleased that Sue Dorn is joining our staff in this important role. She will bring to the Museum long experience and demonstrated skills as a notably effective and highly respected development officer," said Mr. Oldenburg.

Mrs. Dorn comes to the Museum from Yale University, where she most recently served as Associate Vice President and Director of Medical School Development. Under her leadership, in two years over \$108 million was raised toward the \$125 million goal for the Campaign for the Yale School of Medicine.

She was previously a Vice President of the Aspen Institute for Humanistic Studies and of Bank Street College of Education, New York. She was appointed to the Regional Selection Panel of the President's Commission on White House Fellowships.

Mrs. Dorn is a graduate of Stanford University and Bank Street College of Education, where she earned a Master of Science degree and served on its Board

of Trustees. Long active in Stanford University's alumni affairs, she was the first Eastern alumni recipient of the Gold Spike Award, Stanford's highest honor for outstanding volunteer service. A native of Seattle, Washington, Mrs. Dorn was raised in Portland, Oregon. She and her husband, Philip H. Dorn, a computer consultant, have two grown children.
