Joshua Gordon has performed in solo and chamber music recitals at Tanglewood, the Victoria International Festival, and The Juilliard School, among others. A member of the New York Chamber Soloists since 1984, Mr. Gordon appeared with the Juilliard Quartet on PBS's "Live From Lincoln Center: Juilliard at 80." He has performed in many contemporary music programs and is currently principal cello for the Colonial Symphony in Madison, New Jersey.

A native of Boulder, Joy Michele Cline has been studying the piano since she was five years old. In 1978 she made her debut with the Colorado Philharmonic and, since then, she has performed in both solo and chamber music recitals throughout the United States and in Italy. Ms. Cline received her bachelor and master degrees in music from The Juilliard School in 1985. She has studied with William Masselos, Adele Marcus, Samuel Sanders, Marshall Williamson, and Thomas Grubb.
