The program will conclude with a few words from Miss Hepburn herself.

At 9:15 p.m. the sounds of the trumpet will call guests to the upstairs ballroom. Tables will be lavishly arrayed with swirls of grapevine cascading from slender vases that will also overflow with roses and rubrum lilies, nerines, cosmos, and pink pepperberries.
