PIANIST RUDOLF MEISTER TO PERFORM WORK BY JOHN CAGE

Friday and Saturday, August 5 and 6, 7:30 p.m.

A complete performance of John Cage's <u>Sonatas and Interludes</u> is the sixth program in The Museum of Modern Art's SUMMERGARDEN series on August 5 and 6. The work, Cage's best-known composition for "prepared piano," is performed by West German pianist Rudolf Meister. Mr. Meister is a recent graduate of The Juilliard School, where he was a student of Jacob Lateiner. Concerts begin at 7:30 p.m. The program is as follows:

JOHN CAGE, Sonatas and Interludes (1946-48)

Sonatas I-IV First Interlude Sonatas V-VIII Second Interlude Third Interlude Sonatas IX-XII Fourth Interlude Sonatas XIII-XVI

(Numbers XIV and XV called ""Gemini"--after the work by Richard Lippold")

In the evening's program notes, artistic director Paul Zukofsky describes the prepared piano:

A prepared piano is created by inserting screws, bolts, nuts, pieces of rubber, etc. between the strings of the desired pitches (for this program forty-five strings are so prepared). The piano is then played in the normal way (on the keys), but the resultant sound is completely different, as the strings can no longer vibrate in their normal mode . . . Cage invented the prepared piano in order to provide an inexpensive and efficient substitute for a percussion ensemble.
