The Museum of Modern Art begins its fall season of Saturday-morning programs for children ages five to ten and their adult friends on October 2, 1993. Drop-in guided walks through the Museum's galleries introduce children and their adult friends to the diverse world of modern art. Each week, participants explore different aspects of the Museum's collection.

Themes include Braving the Elements, Uncommon Animals, Fateful Folktales, About the Movies, Dreams of Sorts, and Winsome Stories. Museum staff introduce the films, provide notes, and suggest follow-up activities in the Museum's Galleries.

Family Films is planned in cooperation with Maureen Gaffney of the Media Center for Children. For individual film titles, consult the film listings for these dates. Films are shown in the Museum's Roy and Niuta Titus Theater 2. Admission is \$5 per family. Tickets may be purchased at the Lobby Information Desk. Enter the Museum at 11 West 53 Street.
