NEW CANADIAN VIDEO

Through September 6, 1994

An exhibition of experimental video art from Canada's Western provinces, on view at The Museum of Modern Art through September 6, 1994, emphasizes the region's rich cultural and social diversity. NEW CANADIAN VIDEO features twenty-six videotapes that focus on such issues as history, identity, culture, and sexuality in relation to the Canadian experience.

The works in the program incorporate poetry, rituals, performances, dramatic interpretations, and nonfiction methods as ways of relaying information. The videotapes were made through media centers, both privately and state funded, that provide community resources for production and distribution.

Highlights include: Chinaman's Peak: Walking the Mountain (1992, Paul Wong), which honors the spirits of Chinese pioneers in Canada; Skinned (1993, Jennifer Abbott and David Odhiambo), on the specific historical, psychological, and social implications of relationships between black men and white women; and New View, New Eyes (1993, Gitanjali), which weaves poetry, conversation, and journal entries to challenge stereotypes of India.

NEW CANADIAN VIDEO was organized by Sally Berger, Curatorial Assistant, with Barbara London, Associate Curator, Department of Film and Video.
