THE MUSEUM OF MODERN ART CONTINUES ITS FAMILY PROGRAMS Saturdays, October 1, through December 10, 1994

The Museum of Modern Art begins its fall season of Saturday-morning programs for children, ages four to ten, and their adult friends on October 1, 1994. Continuing through December 10, the programs include **Family Gallery Programs**, and **Tours for Tots**, which are offered during the Museum's nonpublic hours, and **Family Films**. 12:00 p.m. - 1:00 p.m.

An antidote for TV blues, this season's program ranges from live action films, to animation to documentaries. Themes include *Suspense Classics*, *Sensational Shapes*, *Constructive Plans*, and *Mapping Journeys*. Museum staff introduce the films, provide notes, and suggest follow-up activities in the Museum's galleries.

For individual film titles, consult film listings for these dates. Films are shown in the Museum's Roy and Niuta Titus Theater 2. Admission is \$5 per family. Tickets may be purchased at the Lobby Information Desk. Enter the Museum at 11 West 53 Street.
