LAURENCE KARDISH

Laurence Kardish, Curator and Coordinator of Film Exhibitions, Department of Film and Video, The Museum of Modern Art, who has organized the **STRICTLY 0Z: A HISTORY OF AUSTRALIAN FILM** exhibition, has been with the Museum since 1968. He has organized the exhibitions JEAN-LUC GODARD: SON+IMAGE, 1974-1991 (1992); CANNES 45 YEARS: FESTIVAL INTERNATIONAL DU FILM (1992); JUNCTION AND JOURNEY: TRAINS AND FILM (1991), for which he edited the accompanying publication; COLOMBIAN CINEMA: FROM MAGIC TO REALISM (1990); MARIN KARMITZ AND MK2 (1989); JOHN CASSAVETES: FILMMAKER AND ACTOR (1989); FRENCH FILM FESTIVAL: PERSPECTIVES ON FRENCH CINEMA (1988); and STZ: THE FILMS OF ETTORE SCOLA, BERTRAND TAVERNIER, AND KRZYSZTOF ZANUSSI (coorganized with Stephen Harvey, 1987).

Since 1972 Mr. Kardish has been involved in the selection of films for NEW DIRECTORS/NEW FILMS, the annual series presented in association with the Film Society of Lincoln Center. He coorganizes CINEPROBE, an ongoing series at the Museum featuring independent filmmakers, and organizes the annual series RECENT FILMS FROM GERMANY. He has also organized exhibitions of national cinemas including Scandinavia (1980), Senegal (1978), and Frenchspeaking Canada (1972), and exhibitions of independent American filmmakers such as Les Blank (1979), Emile de Antonio (1975), and Shirley Clarke (1971).

In 1991 Mr. Kardish was a member of the advisory selection committee for the Sundance Film Festival, Park City, Utah, and has served on juries for the Cannes Film Festival (*Camera d'Or*, 1986) and for the PBS series *Independent Focus* (1986-93). In addition to having been a member of such grants panels as

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the Jerome Foundation and the Rockefeller Foundation, Mr. Kardish has been a board member for both the Collective for Living Cinema and the National Alliance of Media Arts Centers.

Mr. Kardish is the author of *Reel Plastic Magic* (1972), a textbook on American filmmaking, and has also been a playwright and filmmaker. His feature film *Slow Run* (1968) is in the National Film Archive of the British Film Institute.

A native of Canada, Mr. Kardish holds a degree in philosophy from Carleton University, Ottawa (1966), and a Master of Fine Arts in Film, Television, and Radio from Columbia University, New York (1968).

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
