Christopher Mount, Assistant Curator, Department of Architecture and Design, who organized Stenberg Brothers: Constructing a Revolution in Soviet Design, began at The Museum of Modern Art in 1984 as a Curatorial Intern in the Department of Drawings. After a year as Assistant to the Registrar, he joined the Department of Architecture and Design as a Cataloger. He became Curatorial Assistant in 1990, and Assistant Curator in 1995.

Mr. Mount has organized numerous exhibitions at the Museum, including the architecture and design segment of From Bauhaus to Pop: Masterworks Given by Philip Johnson (June 6-September 3, 1996), Refining the Sports Car: Jaguar's E-Type (April 3-August 20, 1996); Piet Mondrian's De Stijl Colleagues (October 12, 1995–February 6, 1996); Recent Acquisitions: Sixtieth Anniversary of the Design Collection (February 15–June 4, 1995); Typography and the Poster (December 8, 1994–June 1, 1995); Designed for Speed: Three Automobiles by Ferrari (November 4, 1993–March 1, 1994); Projects 35: Stephen Kroninger (July 2-August 9, 1992); and Kaj Franck: Designer (April 16-October 12, 1992).

In addition to the exhibition catalogue for Stenberg Brothers: Constructing a Revolution in Soviet Design, Mr. Mount wrote Forward to Film Posters of the Russian Avant-Garde (Taschen Press, 1995). His articles have appeared in Automobile Magazine, Chicago Tribune Sunday Arts Magazine, Graphis, IDEA Magazine, and Print.

Since the fall of 1995, Mr. Mount has been associated with Parsons School of Design, New York. An Adjunct Professor in the Communication Design Program, he developed a required course for undergraduates on the history of twentieth-century design.
