NEW SEASON OF FAMILY PROGRAMS BEGINS AT THE MUSEUM OF MODERN ART Saturdays, October 4–December 13 (except November 29)

On October 4, 1997, The Museum of Modern Art begins its fall season of Saturday-morning family programs for children ages five to ten accompanied by an adult. Designed for participation by the entire family, the fall series continues through December 13 (with the exception of November 29).
