Dear Friend:

We take pleasure in sending you the enclosed Museum Bulletin which we think you will find of unusual interest.

We should like to call your attention particularly to the article on <u>Picasso at Work</u> by John Groth, artist-correspondent, the first American to visit Picasso in his studio after the liberation of Paris. Preceding Mr. Groth's article is a report on Picasso during the four-year-period of occupation 1940-1944--a digest with notes by Alfred H. Barr, Jr. These are illustrated with a drawing of Picasso in his studio by Groth and recent photographs of the artist and his work.

Another article of great interest in the current <u>Bulletin</u> is the account by Lincoln Kirstein of French films during the occupation. Pvt. Kirstein is with the Third U. S. Army and has been in France since shortly after D-day.
