In 1972 and in 1976, The Museum of Modern Art received two grants from the National Endowment for the Arts, a Federal agency, for the acquisition of drawings by living American artists.

The National Endowment for the Arts grants were made with the provision that matching sums be found elsewhere. The exhibition AMERICAN DRAWN AND MATCHED is the result, a collaboration between the Federal Government, private individuals and foundations. Thirty-two artists are represented by fifty drawings.






