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

The Museum of Modern Art, New York

The Drawings collection of The Museum of Modern Art numbers approximately six thousand works, assembled through gifts and purchases, over a period of seven decades. Although other major drawing collections exist in American museums, our collection's exclusive commitment to the modern and contemporary periods, spanning the years 1866 to the present, makes it unique in the United States, the only comparable international collection being that of the Musée national d'art moderne in Paris.

In its early history, the collection purportedly focused on works intended specifically to complement and support the Museum's painting and sculpture holdings. However, in later years, as graphic work was increasingly recognized as the singular and consummate register of expression it is, acquisition priorities were reoriented accordingly. This shift reflects a changing perception of drawing: from that of an artist's tentative voice-often to be further developed in another medium-to that of a voice that speaks for itself. Today, more than ever before, drawing is acknowledged not as a supporting discipline, but as a parallel one-fresh, idiosyncratic, eloquent, unique in its own right.


The Museum's collecting activity over the past ten years has been of a rich and varied nature. One prevailing ambition has been to acquire incontestable masterpieces from the modern and contemporary periods, despite the increasing difficulty of obtaining such works. In addition, the Department of Drawings has attempted to fill out the narrative of certain historical

movements and particular artists' careers, and to add works (such as those by self-taught artists) that enrich and expand the canonical reading of art history as we may reassess it today. The department has also sought to recognize and collect in depth the work of certain living artists, and to be attentive to art being made now, both in Europe and the Americas.

The two exhibitions presented consecutively in the Ronald S. Lauder Galleries—the first devoted to the modern period, the second to the contemporary—reflect the taste and discernment of those who

have actively contributed to the constitution of this collection in recent years: the Drawings department's curatorial staff, the Trustee Committee on Drawings, and, most recently, the Friends of Contemporary Drawing. The thoughtful and fruitful dialogue among these participants and the generosity of many donors, corresponding to a long tradition of enlightened patronage at The Museum of Modern Art, are eloquently visible in the quality and diversity of these recent acquisitions.
