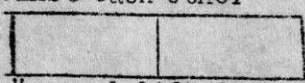

INSTALLATION NOTES:

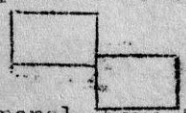
The exhibition should be hung in the order indicated by the CHECK AND INSTALLATION LIST. The lines on the list indicate the general divisions of the exhibition. To preserve continuity, panels within any one of these divisions should be hung on the same wall or without interruption on adjoining walls.

1. Parts of Panels 2,6 and 19 should be installed in continuous sequence, butting against each other so that each appears to be one long panel.
2. The parts of Panels 8 to 14 have been designed so that they may be hung in any of the three ways shown below:

(a) - Butting against each other



(b) - With the "a" panel lifted so that only 6 inches butts against the "b" panel



(c) - With the "a" panel above the "b" panel
