- Background in research is essential, with astute working knowledge of qualitative research methods, data collection and organization, and project management.
- Event management experience, strong communication skills, and the ability to work collaboratively.
- Ability to work evening and late hours to accommodate public program schedule.
- Self-starter with ability to work in a fast-paced, team-driven environment.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills with ability to interact with a wide range of staff, cultural professionals, and audiences.

The Fellowship serves as a launching pad for individuals within the arts and management fields to hone their skills and attain real world experience with structure and support. Fellows are expected to work Monday through Thursday with some weekend and evening hours as required.
