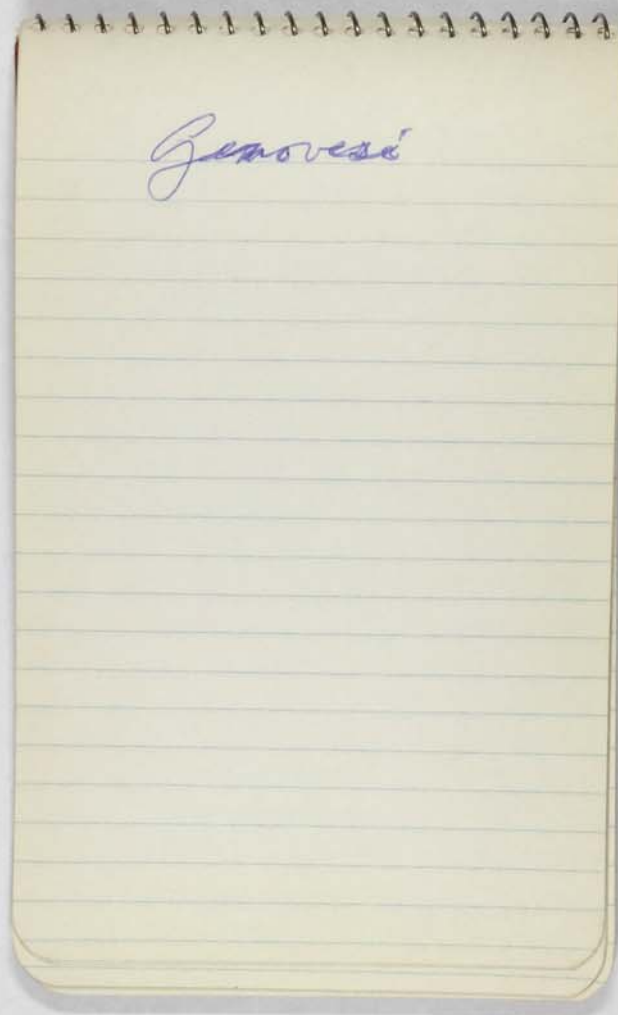
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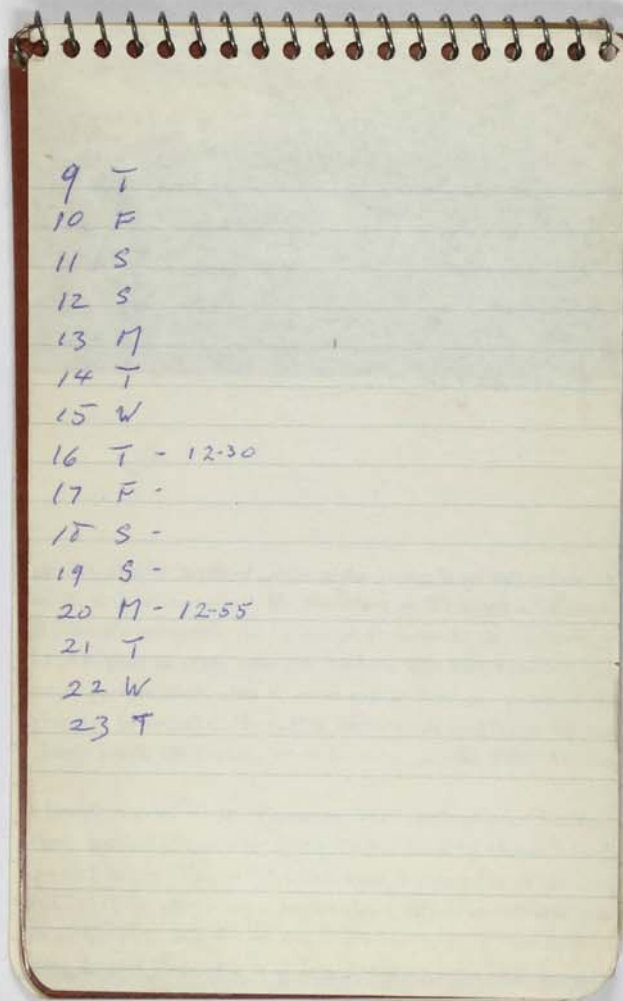
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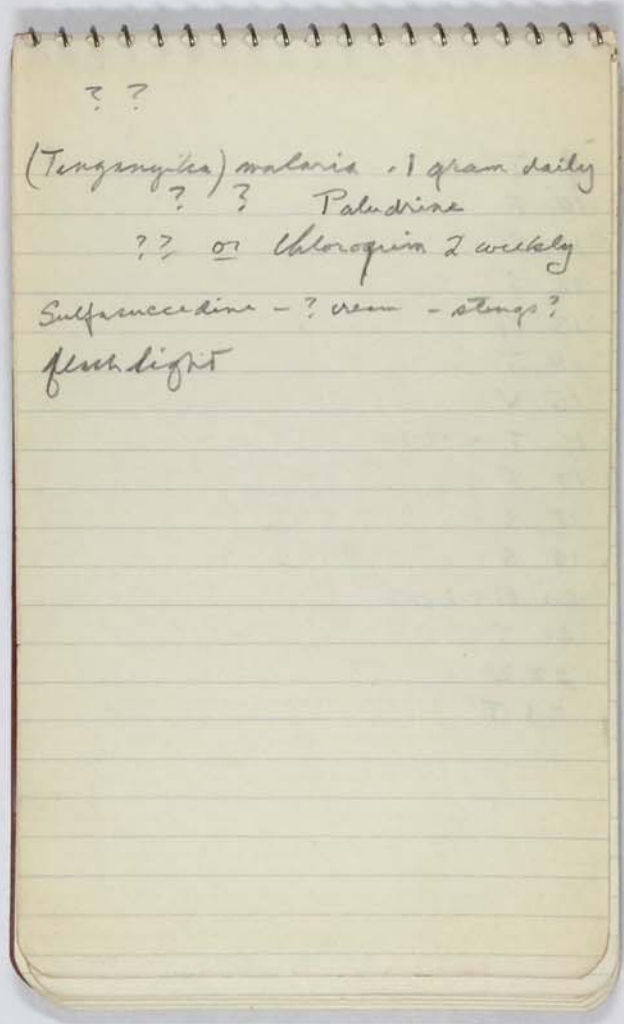
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"What I want to see on my first visit to Greece"

ALFRED H. BARR, Jr., Director of the Collections of New York's Museum of Modern Art, said just before he left New York: "I want to be a tourist in Greece, to see it in spring." Then he added, in a voice not much louder than a whisper, "And, I want to take off my shoes at Missolonghi where Byron died." He went in May, with his wife who had been to Greece many times, in time to catch the wild flowers in their wildest colour. He followed the obvious tracks, saw the Acropolis with sunshine falling like needles on the yellowed Parthenon, watched it turn, at dusk, the colour of dying roses. At Sounion, Poseidon's temple, about forty miles from Athens, he stood between the white, fluted, diamond-polished columns buffeted by salty winds smelling of thyme and sunburned earth. He saw "the Cretan tradition not in Crete but at Mycenae". For the great Byzantine works, he went to Daphni only a few miles from Athens. He rested at Olympia, saw its steel-grey olive groves, walked over chalky yellow and mauve grasses, past stones softened by ages. Later, he visited Delphi, that noble, timeless perfection on Mount Parnassus. From its stadium, the austere and beautiful mathematical oval, he watched, in the cyclamen shadows of evening, the great eagles swooping from the sides of the mountains. After looking at Byron's house in Missolonghi where the poet died of a fever, Mr. Barr followed the causeway across the lagoon to the sea, and there at a waterfront café tasted the town's great product, the chewy *avgotaraho*, dried fish roe preserved in beeswax.
