Works may be rented for a two or three month period. The rental fee may be applied toward the purchase price.

Since ite inception the program has been increasingly successful, and we are grateful to the more than 100 participating galleries whose generous cooperation enables us to present a wide cross section of contemporary art.

To supplement the regular operations of the Art Lending Service, the Penthouse Exhibitions include a few works beyond the size and price range normally available. As group shows they attempt to bring together a diverse selection of significant current work by contemporary artists.
