February 9, 1972

On January 14 I was asked to perform a piece on a local television station by Phyllis Lutjeans. My first proposal was to eat the recorded show as it was being taped and simultaneously broadcast. The viewer would have seen me eating the show he was watching. This proved technically impossible, and I was getting little cooperation from the staff of the station. After several other proposals were censored by the station or by Phyllis Lutjeans, I agreed to an interview situation. I arrived at the station with my own video crew so that I could have my own tape. While the taping was in progress, I requested that it be transmitted live. Since the station was not broadcasting at the time, they complied. In the course of the interview, Mrd. Lutjeans asked me to talk about some of the pieces I had thought of doing. I demonstrated a TV highjack. Holding a knife at her throat, I threatened her life if the station stopped the live transmission. I told her I had planned to make her perform obscene acts. At the end of the recording I asked for the tape of the show. I walked into the hall, unwound the recl, and destroyed the show by dousing the tape with acetone. The station manager was irate, and I offered him my tape which included the show and its destruction, but he refused.
