Thank you for your letter of Hovester 27th, concerning the possible purchase of Feito's Humber 1h7 from NEW SPARISH PAINTIES AND SCULPTURE by the Callery's Woman's Committee. I must inform you however that since the value declarations for Canadian customs were made out the Caleria Armend in Paris, as the artist's agents and landers of the paintings to the condition, have revalued all the Feito paintings, and the actual price of the Feito Humber 1h7 is \$2,062.00, rather than \$1,600.00. I imagine that this adjustment has been made in view of several international sources Feito has received in the past year.
