However, at the last minute a painting included in the British section had to be withdrawn and returned at the order of The Bank of England. The removal of this painting by Minton leaves this section sadly depleted, and thus qualitatively not up to the standard of the French and Italian groups.

Unfortunately this museum does not own examples of this artist, nor does any dealer in New York at theppresent time. I am therefore writing to ask if you would find it possible under the circumstances to lend a painting by this artist to the exhibition. We would need the painting by the middle of August in order to join the already assembled pictures in time for shipment, and it would be returned to you in June of 1954. The Museum assumes all insurance and transportation costs, and specially built boxes will safeguard the painting while on tour.
