
COMMENTS: Yoko Ono's Air Dispenser is an idea that developed out of her Sky Dispenser from 1966 or 1967, and also her void or reduction works that require one to imagine them. The notion of air as art was explored by other artists, notably Marcel Duchamp's Paris Air, 1919; Yves Klein's Le Vide, 1958; and Piero Manzon'i's Air Bodies, 1958. Other Fluxus artists air works were Ay-O's Air Sculpture; George Brecht's Air; Ben Vautier's Flux Nothing, and Yoshimasa Wada's Cough. An Air Dispenser is in the Archiv Sohm at the Staatsgalerie Stuttgart.
