If a performer is uncertain whether a cue word has been spoken, s/he should (usually in a whisper) ask the performer who should have spoken the cue word whether s/he has said the word or completed the speech that it ends. If widely separated from the other performer, the uncertain one may inquire out loud in forms such as, "Did you say your last 'butter knife'?" or "Did you say 'ropy'?"

Seven speeches out of thirteen should each be addressed to a particular person.


