THE ARTIST IN HIS STUDIO: This exhibition of photographs by Alexander Liberman, of the leading artists of

the School of Paris, is now being shown at the Musee des Arts Decoratifs in Paris and will afterwards circulate through France for a period of two to three months. Mr. Liberman's book of the same title has recently begun to appear in European editions. The photographs show such artists as Braque, Chagall, Dubuffet, Giacometti, Leger, Matisse and Rouault in their country and city houses and in their studios. Their palettes and work-tables and the objects with which they surround themselves are recorded and their personalities are revealed as they are photographed alone or with their families.

Packing and costs: The exhibition is packed in 4 cases, with a total weight of 623.16 kilos and cubage of 2.654 cubic metres. It is available, as are the others, for the costs of transportation from the preceding city.

Availability: The exhibition has tentatively been offered to Brussels in March and could be available for showings in Scandinavia for a three-months' period thereafter. Alternative: Postpone the tour in Scandinavia until early Fall of 1962, beginning in September.

DRAWINGS, WATERCOLORS AND GRAPHICS BY BEN SHAHN: This exhibition is now in preparation as a major portion of a larger exhibition we are sending to the Stedelijk Museum in Amsterdam for an opening on December 15, 1961. Detailed information on its contents is not yet available, but I can tell you that it will include about 60 works, covering the major phases of Shahn's distinguished career. The full exhibition, which includes paintings as well as graphics, cannot, because of our commitments to lenders, be shown in more than four cities - already scheduled; but the graphics section will contain work of the highest quality.

Costs: Because of the high valuation placed upon this material, we are asking that exhibitors pay a portion of the insurance costs in addition to transportation from the preceding city. I would estimate the insurance fee at approximately \$200 for each exhibitor.

Availability: We are suggesting that this exhibition begin its Scandinavian tour in September, 1962.

All these exhibitions have been offered to Mr. Bengt Broms of the Finnish-American Society in Helsinki, Dr. Carl Nordenfalk of the National Museum in Stockholm and Mr. Per Rom of the Riksgalleriet in Oslo. I hope you will find it possible to communicate with your colleagues in these institutions regarding coordination of scheduling.

They are all excibitions of the highest quality. Some of them may already have come to your attention because of their successful showing in other European countries. I hope you will find it possible to schedule one or more of them for your museum and since I understand that the operations of your museum include the circulation of exhibitions to other Norwegian museums, I should appreciate suggestions as to other institutions where these exhibitions could be shown to best advantage.

We had previously offered it to Eunstnernes Hus in Oslo, but have been advised that its exhibition schedule has been consitted until Spring of 1963.

Costs: In addition to the costs of one-way transportation from the preceding city, we are requesting that each exhibitor reinharse us for a portion of the insurance costs. This assumts to \$250 as a flat fee to each exhibitor. For your information in estimating transportation costs, the exhibition is packed in 19 cases with a total cubage of 17.17 cubic metres and a total weight of 2,833 kilos.

We have no objection to your keeping it until May 20. At the moment I cannot tell you where the exhibition is to be sent following your showing, but I shall, of course, let you know as soon as possible.

I am sending you enclosed a copy of the English typescript for the text panels, arranged in the order in which they appear in the check list. This can be translated into Swedish for mounting on panels to substitute for the English panels accompanying the exhibition, if you so desire, or for an explanatory booklet - or both. Mr. Drexler had originally requested that no catalog be published for the exhibition, since he is writing a book on the material contained in it. However, he has now agreed to permit exhibitors to issue an illustrated descriptive pamphlet on the exhibition. It was a great pleasure meeting you during your whilt to New York, and I do hope that our conversation and this letter can mark the beginning of an increased progress of exhibition exchange with Sucdam.

Graphic section of Shahn exhibition: We are offering the distinguished group of drawings, prints, posters, books and other graphic material for circulation in Scandinavia beginning in September 1962. I have written Mr. Bengt Bross of the Finalshalmerican Society in Helsinki comparing this proposal, and will shortly be in touch with Material in Calo and both Mr. Emad Jensen of the Louisian Massess in Dummark and the Cultural Affairs Officer for the United States Information Center in Copenhagen, Mr. Reger P. Ross. We hope that your institutions can collaborate in the presentation of this, as well as the other axhibitions listed below.

There will be about 60 works in this section, covering the major phases of Shahn's career. In addition to the cost of one-way transportation from the preceding city, we are asking that exhibiters pay a portion of the insurance costs. I would estimate the insurance fee at approximately \$200, to each exhibitor.

### 2. MODERN AMERICAN DRAWINGS

I am attaching a brief description of this exhibition which gives the relevant information on its contents, packing and arrangement for costs. As I mentioned to you, the show is now in Athens after having been shown very successfully in Spoleto as part of The Festival of Two Worlds and in Israel. We are now in negotiation with Belgrade for the showing following Athens, and in reviewing the subsequent itinerary, I would like to suggest that we attempt to plan a Scandinavian tour, to Belsinki, Stockholm, Oslo and Copenhagen beginning in Jarnary through April 1962. It is tentatively committed for a later opening in Paris on May 15th. While bringing it directly from Ingoslavia would involve a simple transportation move, if this expense could be pre-rated equally among the four Scandinavian cities, it ought not to be too great since the exhibition does not require large packing eases. The only alternative to this proposal would be to defer the showing until later in the spring of 1962, when it could open around April 15th, but this would make it impossible to sendente four Scandinavian abovings without going into the summer manths, which I know is not a good time for any of your museums.

# 3. VISIONARY ARCHITECTURE

I am again emclosing a brief description of the show which gives the relevant information on its contents, pasking and arrangement for costs.

The show closes in Mariah the end of Beessbar, and could again be available to the four Scandinavian cities the beginning of Jamesy 1962. I think it is undoubtedly one of the most brilliant axhibitions undertaken by our Department of Architecture and Design in recent years, and its subject would, I am certain, be of unusual interest to your public in Sweden with their great interest in modern concepts of architecture.
